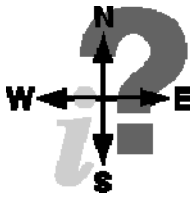


10-4.1 Globalization and Identity

After I analyze the issue ...

After you analyze the issue, look back at your initial ideas. Have you changed your mind after learning new information and looking at different perspectives? Explain.

2. How is a community other than yours adapting and changing due to globalization? How do these changes compare with those experienced in your community?

Step One: Choose an issue linked to globalization, for example, oil and gas shortages due to a natural disaster. Choose a community of interest and look for information on the changes that caused the globalization issue. You can find this information on the Internet, from people in the community and in books.

Step Two: Compare the adaptations and changes experienced by the community to those experienced in your community. Create a chart or other visual representation to compare the effects of this issue on the two communities.

Example

Effect of Globalization	Community X	My Community
Political effects; e.g., new legislation, trade agreements, new government policies		
Economic effects; e.g., employment gains or losses, foreign investment, new industry developed		
Social effects; e.g., immigration, cultural changes, exposure to new traditions/ideas
