

Collages communicate information through pictures and words that are pasted together onto poster board or another surface. The style of a collage depends on the topic and message you are trying to communicate.

Step #1

Identify your topic and message.

Consider focusing on a topic that you know a lot about, one that connects with things you are learning, one that is of personal interest, relevant, or a topic that many people have different opinions about.

Step #2

Plan the design and layout of your collage.

Consider the theme of your poster and design it in a way that reflects that theme. For example, for a serious or dramatic topic, you could use black-and-white photographs with red text. For a more fun look, you could use bright colours and a variety of fonts. Also, consider how to arrange the pictures and words: in different groups? In a circular pattern? Or another way?

Step #3

Collect graphics and text.

You can cut out images and words from magazines or newspapers. Choose graphics that suit (match) your topic. For example, a fun or personal interest topic could use cartoon graphics, and a serious topic could use photographs and diagrams.

Step #4

Put it all together.

Arrange your pictures and texts, and paste them in place. You can also use paint or a marker to add text, lines or shapes to your collage to emphasize certain things or convey your theme.



Reflect.

Reflect on your work and the process you followed to complete your collage. How would you create a collage differently next time?

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
