# **Perspectives on Alberta's Oil Industry**

## **Activities Overview**

Building on the concepts of globalization developed in related issues 1 and 2 and on the skills of examining perspectives and supporting a position from Related Issue 3, students examine perspectives on sustainability and prosperity related to Alberta's oil industry.
